Fellows will benefit from: 1) placement at a nonprofit organization, 2) a financial stipend, 3) engagement with each other and with the Center for Social Innovation's nonprofit development workshops, and 4) wider exposure from the Center for Social Innovation and its partners.

This Fellowship is a six-month program in partnership with participating nonprofit organizations serving the Inland Empire. Fellows will receive a modest stipend and nonprofit leadership development training.

At the Center for Social Innovation-University of California, Riverside, we are looking for applicants that are willing to integrate their knowledge and leverage an organizations mission. We ask that you carefully complete this application as it will assist CSI in pairing you with organizations.
